

Marjorie Field Foil, long-time Glenaire resident, benefits her community

Marjorie Field Foil was among the first residents to call Glenaire “home” when she and her husband, J. E. (Ed) Foil, moved in to the community in 1993. They were “...among some of the original residents to enjoy the Glenaire facilities and services, to connect with old friends and to make new ones,” notes their son, Homer G. Foil of Chapel Hill.

Marjorie was born on May 24, 1910 in Climax, North Carolina. She graduated from Liberty High School and the Woman’s College of the University of North Carolina (now UNC-G). She and Ed were married in 1936 and had two sons, Homer Foil and John Foil of Goldsboro.

After a 36 year teaching career, which included teaching high school economics in Bethany and Wentworth, NC and then elementary students in Reidsville and Raleigh, NC, Marjorie enjoyed retirement in Raleigh. She and Ed enjoyed spending time at their vacation home at Sunset Beach as well and eventually decided to move to Glenaire.

Marjorie was just shy of turning 103 when she passed away on April 28, 2013. She is remembered as always having a compliment ready for those she met, being fond of music of any kind, and enjoying a good laugh. She is survived by her sons, three grandchildren, and six great-grandchildren and extended family.

Her generous bequest of \$10,000 has been placed in the Micou Brown Endowment and will support resident financial assistance which according to Homer Foil, “...is a cause that both my mother and father would have supported wholeheartedly.”
