

# Ann Jordan McNeill

## A Presbyterian Legacy



The Presbyterian Homes Foundation, Inc. is pleased to announce that former Scotia Village Board of Trustees member and Presbyterian Homes Board of Governors member, Mrs. Ann Jordan McNeill, has generously left a gift of over \$14,000, which will benefit Scotia Village to provide resident financial assistance.

Ann was born February 25, 1929 in Wilmington, North Carolina. She graduated with a degree in Elementary Education, from the former, Flora Macdonald College in Red Springs, North Carolina. Ann went on to earn her master's degree in Christian Education from the Presbyterian School of Christian Education (PSCE) in Richmond, Virginia (later merged with Union Theological Seminary, now Union Presbyterian Seminary.)

Ann married the love of her life, Frank Alexander McNeill on March 31, 1955, and the couple was married 63 years. Ann was a dedicated wife and mother of four: Franke, David, Mary K., and Laurie.

Deeply rooted in her Presbyterian faith, Ann's life was largely ministry based, serving early on, as the Director of Christian Education at Red Springs Presbyterian Church. At Bethesda Presbyterian Church, Ann's home church in Aberdeen, she sang for many years in the choir and was a Sunday school teacher. Ann was ordained as a Deacon, was a Ruling Elder, served as the Clerk of Session, and was a Commissioned Lay Preacher in the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina, offering sermons when ministers were away from their churches. She also served as Moderator to the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina, and volunteered on several Presbytery committees.

“Ann's Board service to The Presbyterian Homes, Inc. and to Scotia Village is a testament to the life she lived, consistently honoring her Presbyterian roots in her work,” shares Allen Johnson, Executive Director of Scotia Village. “To leave such a generous gift to Scotia Village, having never been a resident, is very special indeed.”
