

Lewis and Olivia Allen:

Former Glenaire Residents & Generous Philanthropists

In late 2014, The Presbyterian Homes Foundation, Inc. received, for the benefit of Glenaire, an unrestricted estate gift that totaled over \$400,000. This gift was from the estate of Lewis Allen, a longtime resident of Glenaire. In total, the Foundation has received over \$550,000 in estate gifts from Lewis and Olivia Allen. The Presbyterian Homes Foundation, Inc. Board has chosen to direct these gifts to support resident financial assistance at Glenaire.

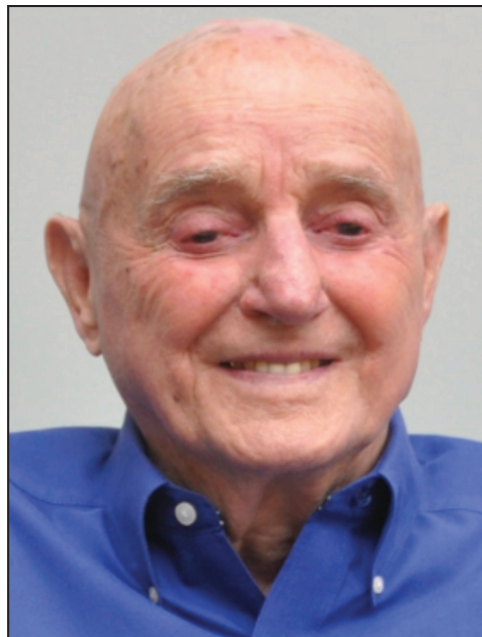
Lewis Allen was born in Person County, NC and was the second of six brothers and a sister. He graduated from Millbrook High School and then enrolled at NCSU. In 1941 he volunteered for the Aviation Cadet program, created by the U.S. Army to train its pilots (later to become the U.S. Air Force). In 1942 he received a 2nd LT commission in the Army Air Corps Reserve. He was assigned to the 91st Bomb Group (Heavy) as a bombardier on a B-17 crew and was deployed to England. While serving his country, Lewis Allen was captured by German troops and held as a POW for two years.

Once he returned to NC, he earned his degree in ceramic engineering from NCSU. He worked with Harbison-Walker refractories in sales and sales management in PA, AL, LA and NC for over 30 years. Lewis passed away in 2013.

Olivia Allen spent her childhood in Person County as well and graduated from Roxboro High School and attended Peace College. She worked for the Selective Service Board and for Peoples Bank in Roxboro, NC. The Allen's only child, a daughter, passed away in 2001 at the age of 50. The couple moved to Glenaire in 2003 where they enjoyed spending time with friends and family. Olivia passed away in 2009 after she and Lewis had enjoyed 60 years of marriage. They are survived by several nephews and nieces-in-law.
